Solemnity of Mary, Holy Mother of God

Twenty-nine days ago, I stood with a friend in the midst of busy *Times Square* in New York City and gazed at the iconic sign that marks the year. I have fond memories of watching the crystal ball fall on television with my family. Two years ago, my sister and I gazed at the scene on a muted television in my mother's hospital room.
